Administering 2nd grade ELA assessments in Canvas is optional. Beginning with Module 6, assessments will be added to the curriculum maps so that teachers can sync them for use in Canvas, but they are not required.

Schools should decide how the grade level will administer the test. If schools want the data entered in Canvas, we highly recommend that students read the passages on paper before answering on the computer.

A top goal of the Escambia County Literacy Association for this year is to shine a spotlight on teachers for their commitment to literacy instruction. The intent is to create a community of literacy educators that cheer each other on. Thanks to all who completed the surveys for teachers and students they would like to see acknowledged.

For the first semester of the 2024-2025 school year, the association would like to shine a spotlight on Audrey Webster of Oakcrest Elementary. Mrs. Webster's second grade students grow because she teaches sound-spelling correspondence with the use of a sound wall. She differentiates her instruction to meet students where they are and move them to grade level performance and beyond. Mrs. Webster promotes writing and uses writing instruction to strengthen comprehension.

The Literacy Association would also like to recognize students in our district who have made improvement in literacy during the second quarter of school. Shout outs for the first semester go to Abigail Gilmore, Molino Park Elementary and Jazhaun Boggan, Pine Forest High School.

With the help of her teacher, Abigail overcame her reluctance to read and is now reading Magic Tree House books in one or two days. She has discovered her desire and ability to learn and there is no stopping her. She puts a lot of effort into her work now, and she is seeing the positive results.

Jazhaun sought out his assistant principals and asked for some advice on how to get better at reading. After receiving strong encouragement from his administrative team, Jazhaun has shown tremendous growth in reading and continues to show that he now has ambitions to strive higher.

New STAR READING Reporting Benchmarks

We have updated the STAR School Benchmarks to reflect the percentile ranks that correlate with FAST achievement levels. This structure blends the percentile ranks used for MTSS with district expectations for growth. On Track indicates that if a student continues to score in this range or above, they are likely to score on-grade level on FAST. The Meeting and Beyond Expectations benchmarks align with FAST Achievement levels 4 and 5. The Intervention benchmark has the widest range, indicating the need for Tier II or Differentiated Tier 1 support for gains. When you log on to the Star Record Book, you will see the School Benchmark by default. To change to MTSS (District Benchmark) or projected State Achievement Levels (STAR Reading), click on the settings wheel in the corner and then change your benchmark setting.
